What Is A Claim?

- Anything ending in "itis" refers to inflammation-of, such as colitis
- Anything a drug is "indicated for," such as drugs being indicated for diarrhea
- Most things with "anti" in the name, such as anti-inflammatory
- The name of any disease, such as Crohn's disease
- Am I making a statement that can be construed as treating, diagnosing, preventing, or curing any disease?




What Are Repercussions of Not Complying?

- Warning Letter
 - Requires legal resources to respond
 - Public record
 - Repeat Warning Letters-can lead to an injunction
 - Scares away investors
 - Class action attorneys
- Class Action Lawsuits
- NAD Cases
- Poor Public Perception

 A normally compliant post can be made non-compliant with the use of a hashtag

Is "Leaky Gut" a Claim

FDA Warning Letter: Great Lakes Gelatin Company

Under the blog titled "COLLAGEN SUPPLEMENTATION AND GASTROINTESTINAL HEALTH" on your website:

"Many who suffer from leaky gut syndrome use collagen hydrolysate as a supplement to aid in symptom management as well."



Possible Alternatives to "Leaky Gut"

Be truthful and not misleading

- > Helps support gut lining integrity
- > Gut lining support
- > Gut barrier support
- - Helps support optimal gut permeability



Implied Covid Claims= High risk

FTC Warning Letter: JB7, LLC

COVID-19 AND GUT MICROBIOTA

Microorganisms in the gut may help identify who is at risk of complications from Covid-19, including severe illness and inflammation. What's striking is that even after recovery, gut microbiota can remain altered and patients can continue showing symptoms like fatigue, dyspnea, and joint pain....

In other words: A leaky gut triggered by an unbalanced gut microbiome allows the virus to leak into the circulatory system, making it easy to spread across organs....



Is "IBS" a Claim





"IBS" Symptomatic Support = Claim

FDA Warning Letter: JLM Nutritionals, Inc. dba JLM Nutrition—Super Naturals Health

On your product description page:


 "Designed to relieve Irritable Bowel Syndrome (IBS) symptoms including diarrhea and constipation"

• "Reduced. . .abdominal pain"



Gut-Brain Claims

Make your point without high risk "buzzwords"



Healthy microbiome = mental clarity



Clear-minded and ready to focus on those important projects.

A healthy digestive system helps support a positive state of mind

"Better Than Drugs" Statements = Risky

FDA Warning Letter: JLM Nutritionals, Inc. dba JLM Nutrition—Super Naturals Health

On your blog "Natural IBS Treatment Versus Prescription Treatment For IBS Symptoms" page:

• "On 04/25/16, Jordyn in Los Angeles wrote: . . . I have been suffering for about a year now with IBS-D. . . . I was then diagnosed with IBS-D. I had no idea that IBS could be so debilitating. . .Luckily I found IBS Formula! I have been off my medications and on this formula for a month. An entire month of no issues, no stomach pains, no missed days of work."



Clinically Proven = Highest regulatory scrutiny

NAD Challenge Case: "Culturelle" Probiotic

NAD noted in its decision that the use of the terms "most clinically proven effective" and "#1 clinically proven effective" indicate to consumers that there is scientific evidence that proves or "establishes" the truth of the advertiser's claim.



Marketing Differences Supplement & Clinical Study Words

Be careful using clinical study terminology to describe products

Anti-inflammatory	Soothing
Anxiety	Mood Support
Insomnia	Sleep support
Antiemetic	Stomach soothing

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Class Actions

The NextFoods GoodBelly Probiotic JuiceDrinks Class Action Lawsuit is Andrade-Heymsfield v. NextFoods, Inc., Case No. 3:21-cv-01446-BTM-MSB, in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of California.







The lawsuit alleges misleading marketing claims

"START YOUR GOODHEALTH GAME PLAN . . . Drink one 8 oz. glass of delicious GoodBelly a day for 12 days."

"Reboot your belly, then make GoodBelly your daily drink to keep your GoodHealth going. Because when your belly smiles the rest of you does too."

"WE DIG SCIENCE. LP299V is naturally occurring in the human gut. It has been studied more than 2 decades and has numerous research trials to show that it may help promote healthy digestion and overall wellness"
