- The extinction of the people groups that have the traditional knowledge and culture about these species

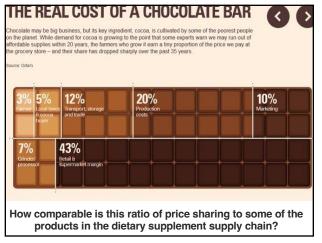
